

1. National Engineering College (NEC)

National Engineering College is set amidst sylvan surroundings against the backdrop of the Western Ghats. It has an excellent rural landscape and is far from the madding crowd. It provides an ideal atmosphere for academic pursuits. The college came into being in 1984, duly sanctioned under the self financing scheme under the Government of Tamil Nadu. During the past thirty six years, the college has grown and expanded in a phenomenal way.

NEC offers a wide variety of high quality education and training opportunities for every student, awarding qualifications through the highly reputed Anna University which is recognized as world class.

Sprawled in a green luxuriant campus, with the alluring backdrop of an enchanting hillock, in NH7 between Madurai and Tirunelveli, NEC provides an exemplary locale for academic pursuits in South Tamil Nadu.

NEC is affiliated to Anna University, Chennai and it is approved by All India Council for Technical Education, New Delhi. From the academic year 2011, the college has attained its autonomous status.

2. Central Library

Central Library acts as a knowledge hub for the academic activities of our Institution with a mission to provide a knowledge gateway to the user community with state-of-the-art technologies. A fully air-conditioned modern separate Library building is housed in an area of around 3911 sq.m. enabled with wi-fi facility and under CCTV surveillances.

Open Access System is followed. In addition to the well-stocked Library, each department has its Library to facilitate easy access to the Faculty, Students and Research Scholars.

The Library has a rich collection of 61236 volumes of books and 24182 titles, 130 National Journals and Technical Magazine, 3476 Back volumes, 2143 e-books, 3317 CDs, 4994 Project reports and 20 Newspapers (both English & Tamil).

Central Library has the subscription of IEEE (ASPP) and Elsevier (Science Direct) online journals and Institutional members of DELNET and NDLI.

e-Learning Management System (e-LMS) that customizes the content of NPTEL Videos and includes our college contents such as e-journals, e-books and e-question banks etc. The students, faculty and research scholars access the e-resources and download the relevant and needed articles.

The Central Library is kept open throughout the year except for government Holidays (Weekdays 08.30 a.m. to 07.30 p.m. and Sundays 09.30 a.m. to 01.00 p.m.)

The Central Library provides excellent library facilities for all the students and faculty members, such as sufficient books, proper seating and reading facility, proper classification and arrangement of books, attractive modern building with high-speed wi-fi connectivity, Web OPAC etc.

2.1 About Central Library

- Book stocking section has the collection of text and reference books as prescribed in the syllabus and also relevant books.
- In the *Periodical Section*, peer reviewed National Journals and Technical Magazines are available and are kept in printed form.
- Reference Section has Reference books, Dictionaries, Encyclopedias, Directories, Exam Guides, Standards, Manuals, Handbooks, Proceedings and collection of University & Autonomous question paper booklets.
- The *Circulation Section* is fully computerized with bar-coded circulation service (Issue, Return and Renewal of library documents)
- Back issue of journal are bounded every year and kept in *Back Volume Section* for reference purpose. Back volumes can also be borrowed by the users.
- Web Online Public Access Catalogue (Web OPAC) facilitates online search queries related to the availability of library resources viz. Books, Journals, CD/DVDs, Back volumes and project reports.
- An A.V.Hall (Audio & Video Section) for organizing NPTEL programme, Spoken Tutorial Workshops, Seminars, Conference & Viva Voce exams.
- **Reprography** and *printing facilities* are available to the users.
- Book Bank Section caters to the needs of students who avail the post-metric scholarship offered by the Government of India. The eligible students can avail six books at a time. The books are issued for a period of one semester and to be returned at the end of the semester.

3. e - Learning Management System (e-LMS)

'e-learning encompasses research, learning and teaching in the digital environment', where students have access to courses offered online with instruction and course materials, instructors notes, course topics, and discussion forums.

Sufficient numbers of systems are available in the e-Library with Internet facility to access the e-resources. Users can get the access e-resources for educational, research and development purpose. It is sponsored and mentored by Ministry of Education, Government of India, through its NMEICT. It is developed, operated and maintained by the Indian Institute of Technology, Kharagpur.

NDLI Club is a platform for conducting learning oriented events, both online and offline, for students of an institute using the contents of NDLI and experts to deliver talks or conduct sessions.

It is a multimedia format that can easily be paused and replayed via DVR. The same multimedia presentation can be distributed on a smartphone, tablet or PC through a DVD or jump drive, YouTube or Internet TV.

Book Team: Watching TV would not help in learning all these minute things which are important for a person. Because expression of views gives a person an identity to personify him. So for being a better learner one should need to be better scholar and for that he definitely need to read mind enriching books.

Television Team: Computer is the superior medium for delivering information provided that is the goal. But this topic is about books vs TV. Just as you must be selective when finding good reading material, the selection process is used to find suitable programming. Once you do, I believe that a multimedia form of delivery has many advantages that outweigh those of the written form. A good point is made about being able to pace yourself with books. Given the same amount of time one typically invests in reading a book, TV could produce greater results. While it's true that reading might better prepare you to express your views that would probably pertain mostly to the written form. TV can teach you verbal communication skills that can include tone, gestures, inflexions, and dynamics.



HIGHLIGHTS (Academic Year 2019 – 2020)


